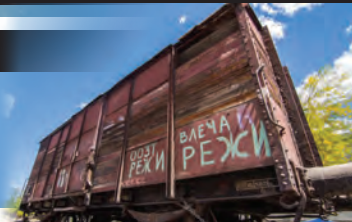

An authentic WWII Rail Car will be on site to view and experience from the inside.

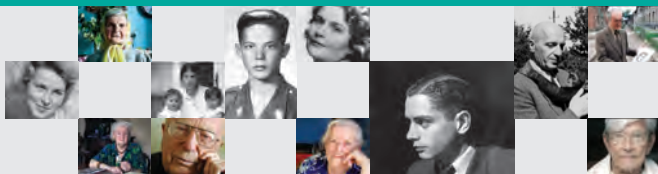

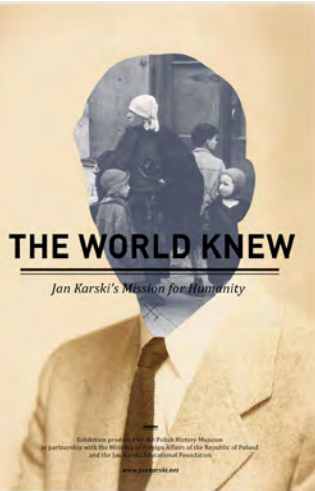
